HERE'S WHAT TO DO.....

- **This is your pledge form** – you may begin recruiting sponsors (pledges) today! Your family, neighbors and friends will be glad to help....show them the great prizes you are trying to win and remind them the money raised is for Scouts with Special Needs. **You must have a minimum of \$30.00 in pledges and/or donations in order to bowl free and to get your free BOWL-O-REE patch.**
- Your leaders will let you know on which day and at what time you are bowling. **Be sure to bring this pledge form with you – it's your ticket to bowl free!!**
- After you have bowled, the officials will certify your score and return your pledge form to you...and then you may return to your sponsors to collect the money. Give the money to your leader who will turn it in to the Scout Service Center, and we will give your patch to him/her. If you have raised \$100 or more, your leader will also be given your custom designed BOWL-O-REE t-shirt.
- Your mom and dad can bowl too! Have them get a pledge form from your leaders – the rules are the same for them.

All Tigers, Cubs, Webelos, Boy Scouts, Venturers and Explorers who raise \$250 or more
